## ESTABLISH A CHAPTER AT YOUR SCHOOL

1. Identify a teacher(s) to serve as Chapter Advisor(s). English and history teachers are preferred, but not required.
2. Schedule an informational meeting to include teacher(s) and administration representative.
3. Complete and return agreement by May 15.
4. Teachers attend 2-hour training in June via Zoom.

## CHAPTER PROGRAM

Students interview U.S. military veterans who share first-person history, life experiences, and lessons of character, leadership, and perseverance.

- ★ Oral history interviews preserved in the Library of Congress
- ★ Students write veterans' service stories for publication in our hardbound book, *Since You Asked™*
- ★ Optional publishing workshops for students to lay out stories using design software
- ★ Community book-signing event to honor veterans and recognize student work
- ★ Civic engagement opportunities
- ★ College scholarships – Ten awards, ranging from one-time \$1,500 to \$17,500 per year for four years

## PARTICIPATION FEE

Schools can establish their chapter as an Arizona State Tax Credit eligible club with their school or district. The cost of participation is the cost to have the students' work published, \$200 per story. Three story minimum per chapter.
